Saint Patrick's Church opened its doors on March 17, 1847. It was reported that over 6 thousand people attended Mass on that day standing in what was an open space in the stark white interior of the new Church. That year thousands of Irish immigrants arrived in Montréal escaping deprivation and starvation of their homeland only to be faced after an arduous sea voyage with Ship Fever, typhus. The sick were housed in fever sheds located at the Port of Montréal, many priests and nuns associated with the newly opened church died caring for the afflicted. And those who survived found refuge in Saint Patrick's and flourished in Montréal.

VIGIL LIGHTS

When you light one of our vigil candles, offer a prayer or intention along with it. You may pray for a special request, for loved ones, those who are sick or suffering or have recently died, you may offer your prayer to a particular Saint, to the Virgin Mary or simply to thank God for His blessing.

“By lighting the candle our prayer is physically represented, and we join our prayers to the light of Christ allowing that light to burn on and on in our souls, even when we have left the church. “My prayer is in my heart,” Father Alar, director of the Association of Marian Helpers, explained. “How do I show this internal prayer? The votive candle is the way we can express in a physical, tangible way our inward prayer. Our prayer is symbolized by the candle.”

FUNERAL AND BURIAL RITES

In our ever-changing society, our funeral rites and burial practices have evolved. With the Church's acceptance of cremation and all the rites that accompany this choice, and Funeral Homes now offering “one-stop” services, young family members who no longer practice the faith will frequently choose burial rites with little or no religious observance. The wishes of the parents and grandparents are not always respected. A baptised person has a right to the full funeral and burial rites of the Church which include a Mass of Christian Burial where the body or the ashes of the deceased are present within the Parish Church.

To assure that you receive the funeral rites and services of the Church upon death, you are advised to leave written funeral and burial instructions with your next of kin, and where they can be located when needed.

UNDERGROUND PARKING AT HEC

The underground parking in the new HEC building is available! The entrance to the garage is on de la Gauchetière Street. Once you are parked, take the elevator to Level One, then once you are at Level One, exit and go to the next elevators on the right; go to Level 2, exit & take the corridor on the left to exit the building. At the end of mass, see the personnel at the door to receive the courtesy ticket – which you will need to re-enter HEC and to exit the garage.
