FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD: AN END AND A BEGINNING

Today's feast is both an end and a beginning. It is the end of the Christmas season since "ordinary time" begins tomorrow. It is also a beginning because it commemorates the event inaugurating Jesus' earthly ministry. For us, today is a transition. On the one hand, we recall and renew our baptism into Christ, the beginning of our sharing the life of God and the beginning of living what baptism implies – witnessing to Christ in our world. On the other hand, it is an ending of Christmas festivity and of commemorating Christ's incarnation. We now focus on his mission on earth and our mission in him.

Today, we end a season and begin again to live what this season implies. We do this in response to the God who searches for us in Christ and calls us again into his very life. We shared that life first at baptism; we are challenged to share it with each other in "ordinary time".

UNDERGROUND PARKING AT HEC

Free underground parking in the HEC building is available for those attending weekend masses. The entrance to the garage is on de la Gauchetière Street. Once you are parked, take the elevator to Level One, then once you are at Level One, exit and go to the next elevators on the right; go to Level 2, exit & take the corridor on the left to exit the building. At the end of mass, see the personnel at the west door of the Basilica to receive the courtesy ticket – which you will need to re-enter HEC and to exit the garage.

NO PARKING IN THE CLERGY PARKING LOT: (EXCEPT FOR STAFF, SERVERS & LECTORS).

VIGIL LIGHTS

When you light one of our vigil candles, offer a prayer or intention along with it. You may pray for a special request, for loved ones, those who are sick or suffering or have recently died, you may offer your prayer to a particular Saint, to the Virgin Mary or simply to thank God for His blessing.

"By lighting the candle our prayer is physically represented, and we join our prayers to the light of Christ allowing that light to burn on and on in our souls, even when we have left the church. "My prayer is in my heart," Father Alar, director of the Association of Marian Helpers, explained. "How do I show this internal prayer? The votive candle is the way we can express in a physical, tangible way our inward prayer. Our prayer is symbolized by the candle."
